The hotel was from the beginning designed and built with a system to control pollution from the electrical supply. The hotel staff takes pride in making your stay as enjoyable as possible.

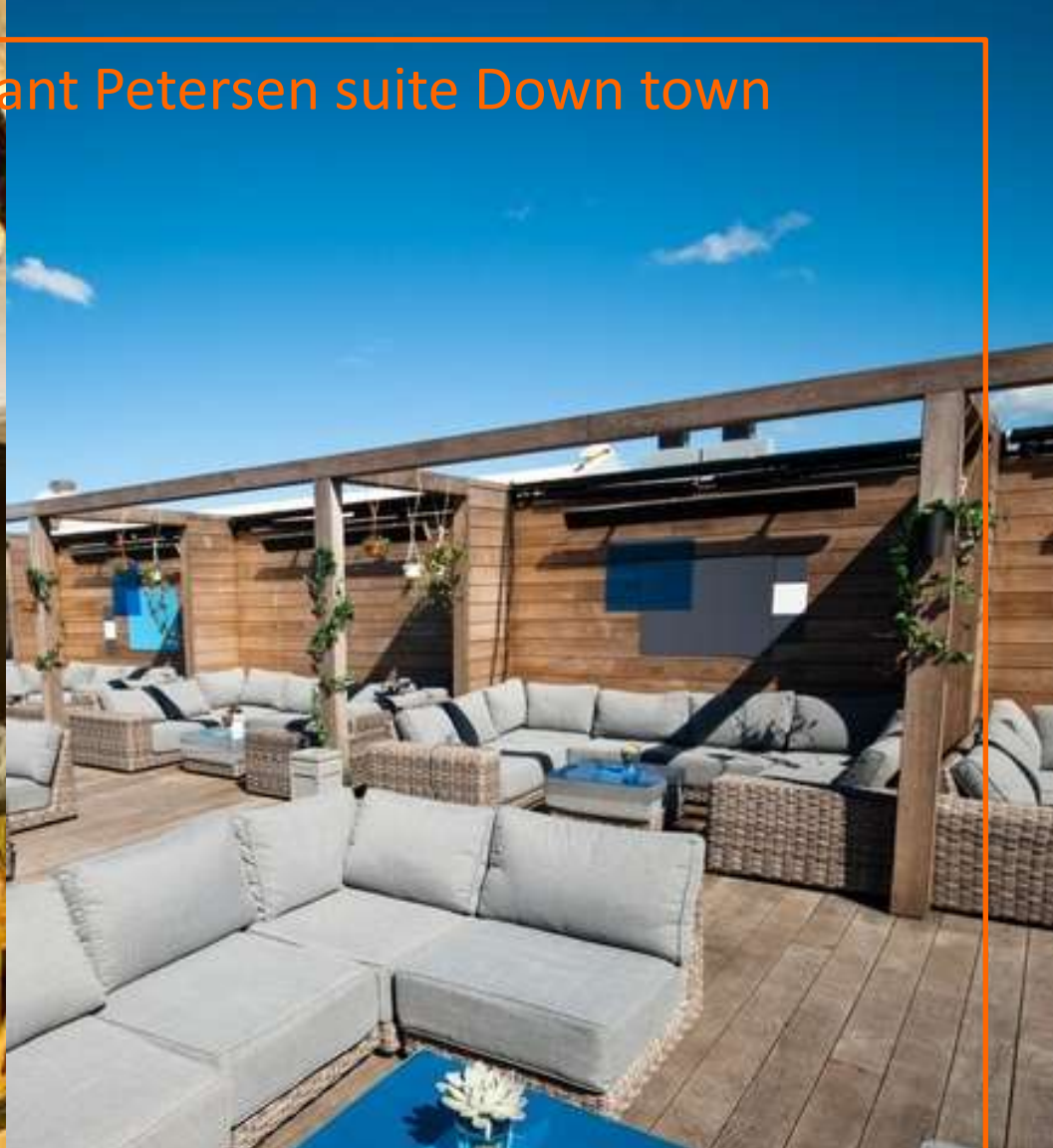

Day 1: Arrival to Reykjavik City and Check into the Hotel



Reykjavík may be one of the smallest capital cities in Europe, but it still packs a powerful cultural punch, where visitors can enjoy a multitude of various events and festivals all year round! With a fascinating history rooted in the great Sagas and its unique location within a land of diverse landscapes – all filled to the brim with beautiful nature, Reykjavík manages to combine a terrific blend of hip and wholesome, but without the stress that usually follows a cosmopolitan metropolis. In fact Icelanders are considered to be so easy-going and gregarious, that they've just added a new travel accolade to their growing collection, this time for being the friendliest nation in the world!

Day 1: Top roof bar / Restaurant Petersen suite Down town



The Petersen Suite is a rooftop lounge and a bar on the top floor of the historic cinema Gamla Bíó. The Petersen Suite is in an old apartment in one of the oldest and most historic buildings in Reykjavík, dating back to 1926. There are many stories about ghosts haunting the building.

Day 2: Golden Circle full day

This day we drive:

1. To the countryside to Thingvellir National Park —walk among the geological wonders of the fissure zone and in the footsteps of the early Viking settlers where the Althingi parliament was founded. It's the UNESCO world heritage site and the site of the original Althingi, considered the oldest democratic parliament in the world. This area is noted for its spectacular lava formations and being the only place in the world where you can see the separation of the North American and European tectonic plates.
2. Lunch.
3. To the Geysir, the "geyser" which gave its name to all other erupting hot springs - hear the bubbling of the mud pots, smell the sulfur in the air and watch in awe as the geyser Strokkur blasts boiling water into the air. The Geysir geothermal area boasts spouting springs, including Strokkur, the most active geyser in Iceland.
4. You will visit the Golden Waterfall – Gullfoss - feel the mist of glacial water as it cascades down one of Iceland's most famous waterfalls. Gullfoss you are given the opportunity to stand next to the amazing waterfall, watching enormous quantities of water tumble violently into a deep, meandering gorge.
5. Snowmobile Ride on 2nd largest Glacier in Europe.
6. Option : Icelandic lager, shark and brennivin on the way.



Day 2: Luxury Super Jeeps offroad



Nowhere but in Iceland will you find vehicles like those we use for our travels today. Crafted for uniquely tough conditions, even a term to describe them had to be invented. “Super Jeep” is the result of decades of insular technical innovation and evolution, from tinkering with old army Jeeps to get further up hill, to our hand-built monsters equally at home crossing Antarctica, the wild Icelandic Highlands – or the highway. Each vehicle is custom built with up to three separate transmissions, two separate steering systems, fully in-cab adjustable four corner air suspension, fully lockable differentials, up to 7.3 liter turbocharged engines, an array of radio equipment, marine-type satellite navigation... Oh, and the biggest available legal road tires in the world. Mercedes Bens Sprinter: *Highly capable super truck with individual seats for your comfort.*

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

The Icelandic climate is warmer than the name suggests, thanks to the Gulf Stream. Summers in Iceland are rather cool, while the winters are relatively warm. The average monthly summer temperature ranges from 10 to 13 °C. During the summer the climate is mild but unstable with possible rain and frequent weather changes. The daily temperature can fluctuate from a minimum 5 °C at night to a maximum of 25 °C during the day.

Banks are open from 09:15 to 16:00. As general rule offices are open from 09:00 to 17:00, in some cases during the summer these hours are from 08:00 to 16:00. Shops are open from 09:00 to 18:00 on weekdays. Credit cards are accepted by most shops, restaurants and organizations and are widely used. The major credit cards in Iceland are Visa and Master Card, although other cards are accepted as well in some places. Tax-free shopping/tax refund. A refund of the local Value Added Tax is available to visitors to Iceland. The refund will result in a reduction of up to 15% of the retail price, provided departure from Iceland is within 30 days after the purchase is made. The purchased amount must be no less than ISK 5.000,- (VAT included) per sales receipt, and all goods (except woolens) must be packed in sealed bags or containers.

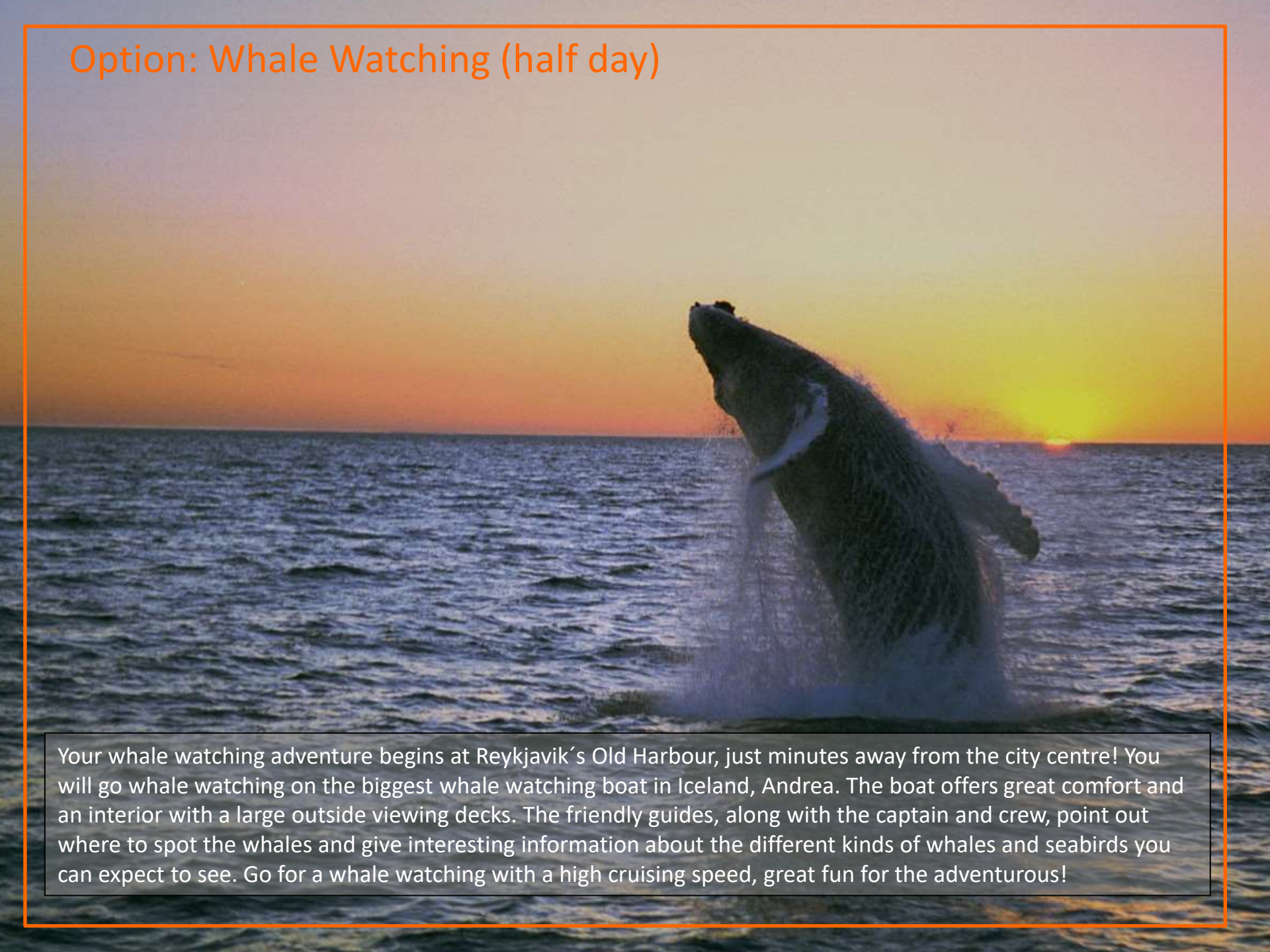

Option: Whale Watching (half day)

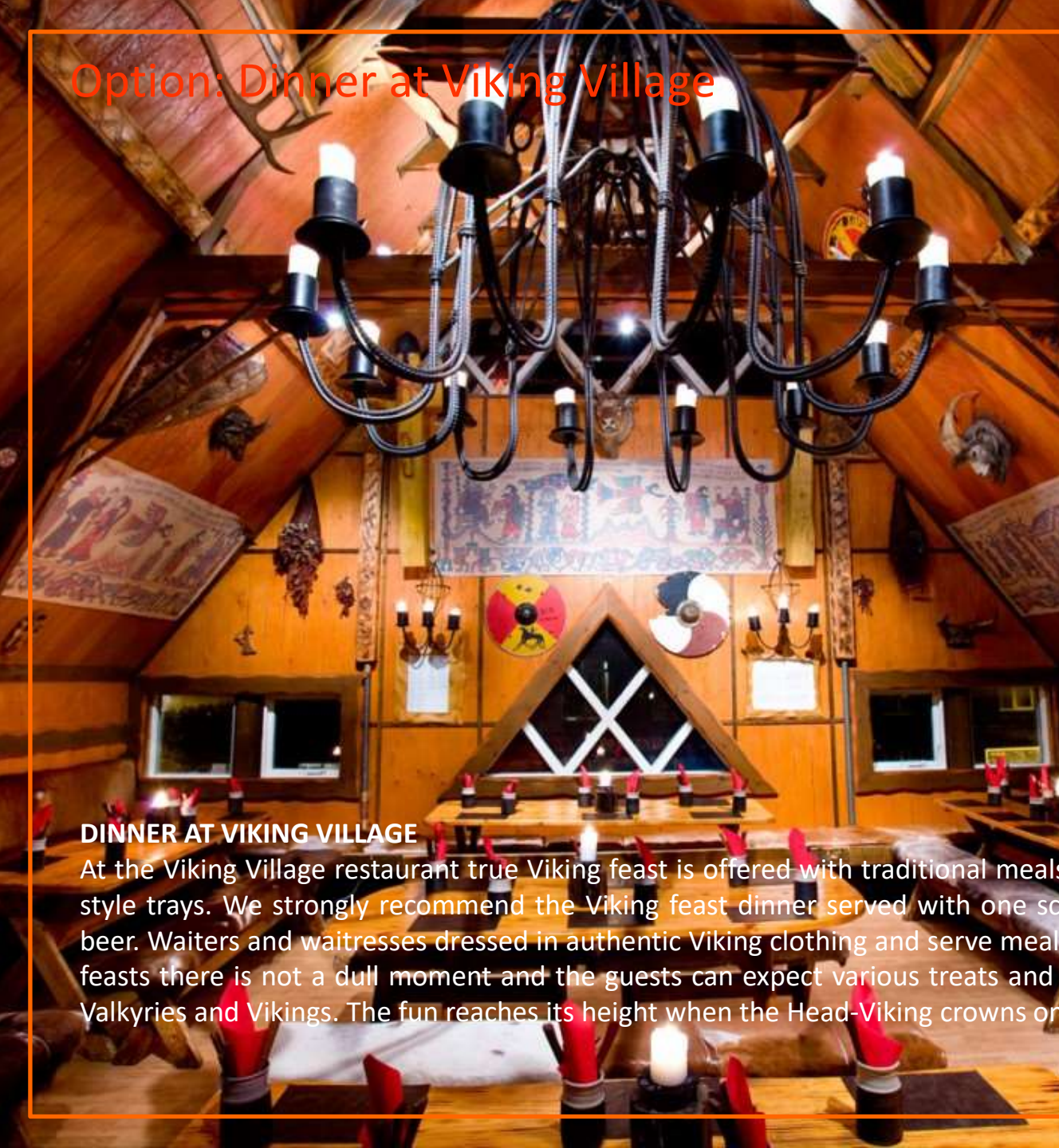

The horses are then saddled and prepared for a riding tour with an experienced guide into the Rauðhólar (Red Hills) and Heiðmörk overlooking Elliðaavatn and along the banks of Rauðavatn. [WEB](#)

Option: Buggy Cars (half day)

Strap into a two-seat Buggy with your partner and prepare to overcome obstacles in the rugged landscape by the slopes of Mt Esja, climbing hills, running through river beds, and more. The Buggies are equipped with 4-point safety harnesses for safety, automatic transmission for driving ease. All you need is a spirit for adventure, and a valid driving license for the driver.
